Dear Parents/Carers,

As you know, we use the Read, Write Inc phonics to teach children how to read. Children have daily phonics sessions to develop their phonic knowledge and ability to read.

Children currently come home with 'book bag books' to read, the aim of these books are for the children to work on their reading skills and with the support of adults in the home, develop a love of reading. Although these books are matched to the sounds your child is learning, the books have not been read before by the child and therefore they may need support and encouragement. These books are read 3 times, to develop fluency and confidence.

The children read Read, Write Inc books daily in school once they get to red group, as part of the phonics session, to develop their fluency, decoding skills and comprehension. The idea is that the children develop confidence by reading the same book over a number of days.

We will now be assigning the books your child reads in their Read, Write Inc sessions via ebooks.

Please note, if your child is reading ditty sheets, these will be sent home with them daily. Please continue to read through the sounds, words and story with your child to develop their fluency.

If your child is in red-grey group, they will read the same book for 3-5 days, this is to develop fluency and confidence before moving on.

If your child is in red-orange group the days will focus on:

Day 1 : focus on reading the green and red words, so that these can be sight read.

- Day 2: read the story through, using as little Fred talk as possible.
- Day 3: reading the story with a storyteller voice and answer the questions at the end of the story.

If your child is in yellow-grey group the days will focus on:


- Day 1: focus on reading the green and red words, so that these can be sight read.
- Day 2: read the story through, using as little Fred talk as possible.
- Day 3: focus on fluency and confidence.
- Day 4: reading with expression.

Day 5: focus on speed and understanding of the story.
