## Key Facts

What is a sculpture?	It is the art of making 3-dimensional forms, especially by carving stone or wood or casting plaster, metal or clay.
What conditions are needed for clay to harden?	Clay needs to be left completely dry so it can harden and cannot have any air pockets as they will cause cracking. As it hardens, clay shrinks because the moisture is leaving it.
What technique is used to finish clay sculptures?	The clay is put in kilns (giant ovens) so it can harden. This finishing technique makes sure the clay is solid and has a stronger structure.






