Outcome– How will our learning be used in real life?

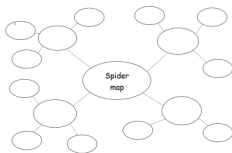
We will be creating an information video to tell people how they can get to Seal and what they will see when they come to the Village.
