



## Staying Safe Online whilst Home Learning

During this time of home learning it is important that all the children are kept safe during remote learning.

Here are some important key facts to remember whilst learning from home.

1. Make sure that you have set age appropriate parental controls on any devices that your children are using.
2. Know what your child is doing whilst using the digital remote, especially if they are online.
3. Make sure that your child is only accessing information that the teachers have set and you are using websites that are age appropriate.
4. Make sure that your child does not share any personal information when using the internet.
5. When taking photos or videos to share with staff please be aware of what your child is wearing i.e. your child should be fully clothed
6. In photos and videos the background should not have obvious house names or numbers, street names etc. Please make sure car registrations are not in shot too. Sometimes we would like to share photos on the school website and class vlogs.
7. Make sure that there is time away from the screens, this is important for their wellbeing and mindfulness.
8. Make sure that you have talked to your child about safety on-line and the dos and do nots.
9. It is important that the children are staying in touch with their friends, please make sure that you are aware of what device they are using to stay in touch and what programme they are using. Be aware when they are in touch with their friends, they should be supervised.
