| 10:30-11am | Reading <br> RWI Phonics <br> Oxford Owl have made available for parents all the ebooks linked to each RWI level. This means we no longer need to upload the books to the webpage. Instead, please go to the webpage below. If you go onto 'ebooks' then you will need to register (this is free of charge) and then you will be able to access all the ebooks and choose the correct banded level for your child. Please note that the RWI phonics scheme is based on lots of repetition. Therefore, we usually read the same book about 3 or 4 times before moving onto a new book. Try answering the comprehension questions at the back. <br> This website also provides lots of other information for parents about phonics.
