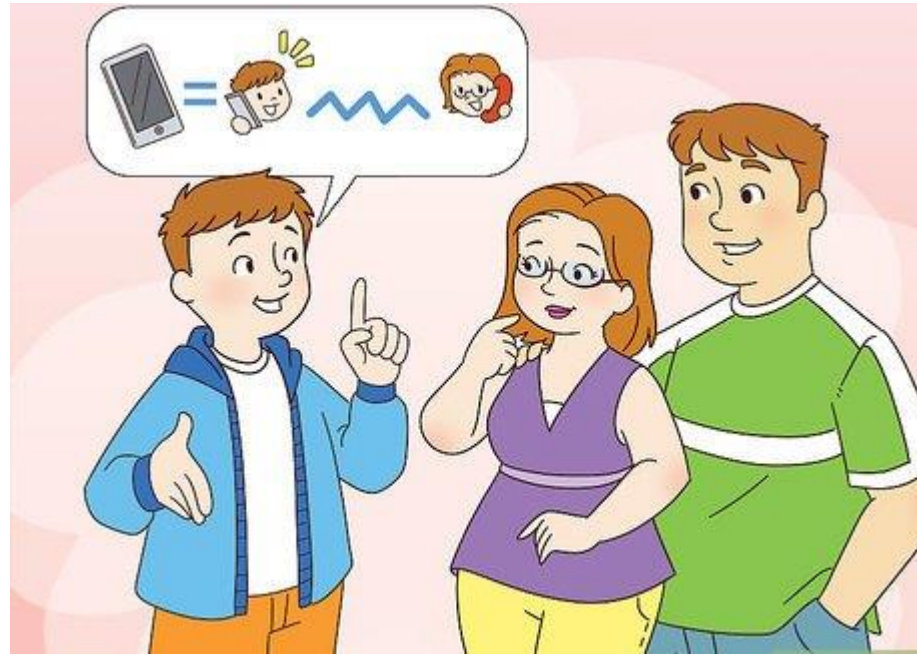
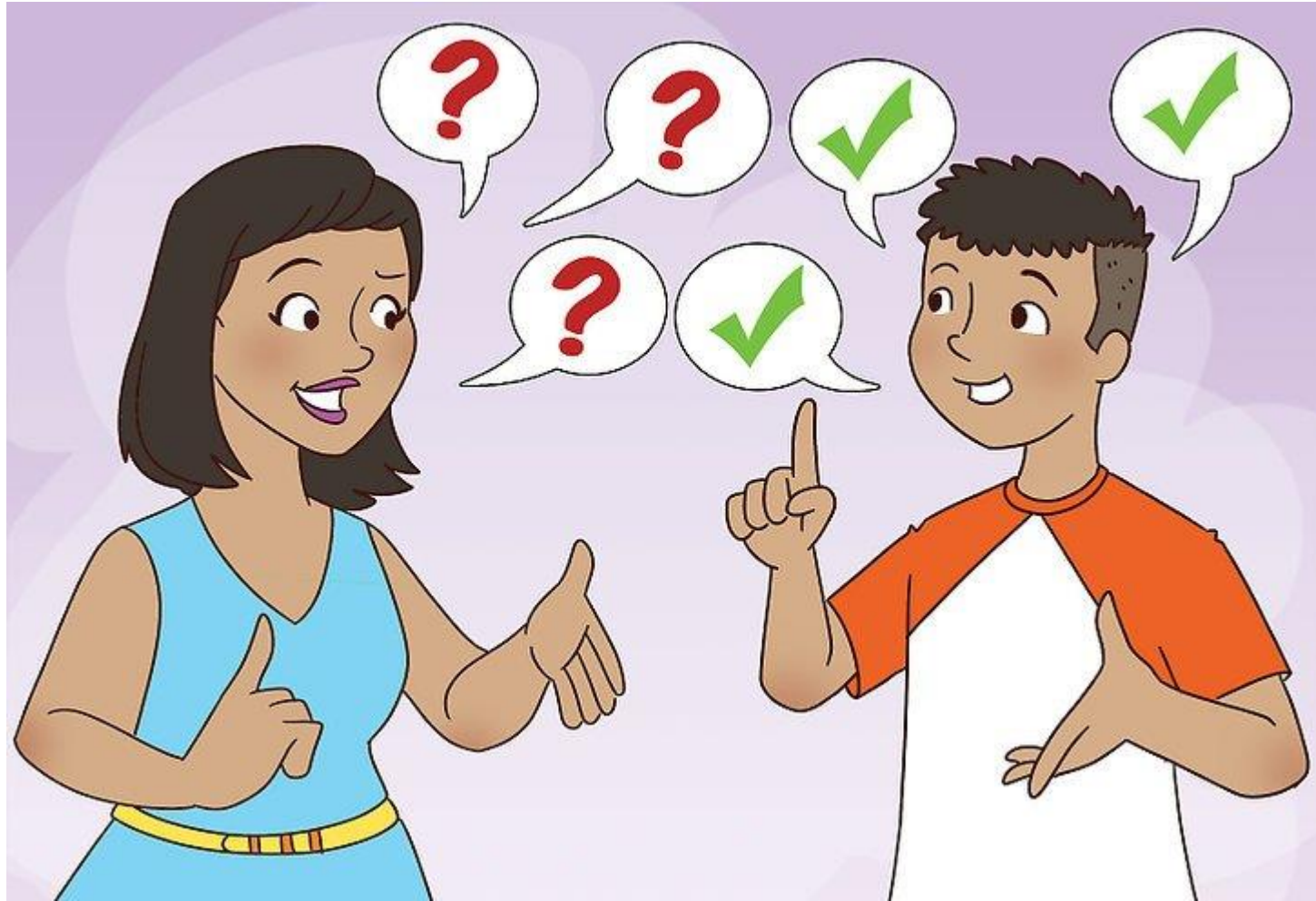


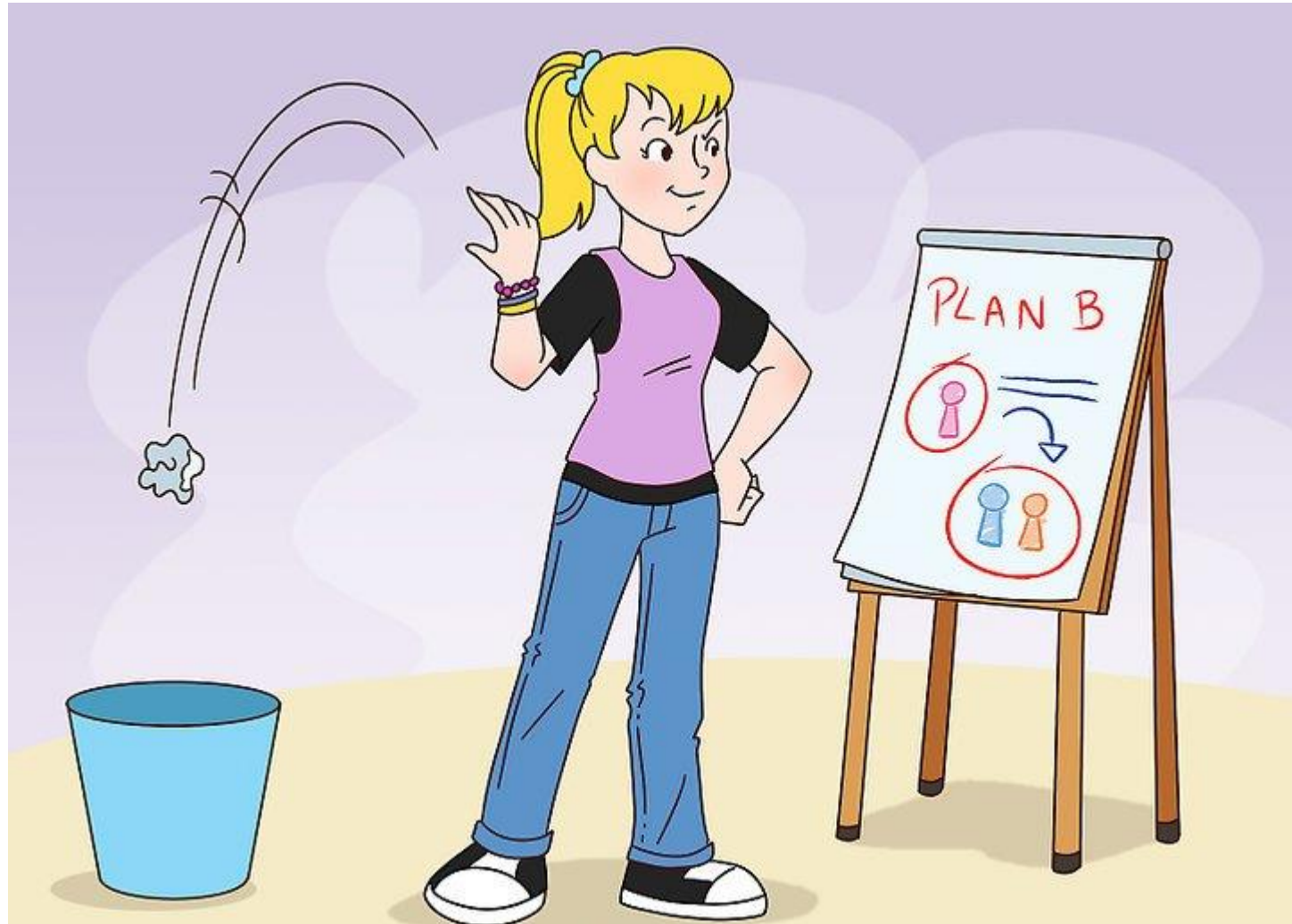
Persuasive Tip #1: You've got to ask for what you want, or you'll never persuade anybody to do anything.



Persuasive Tip #2: To give clear justifications.

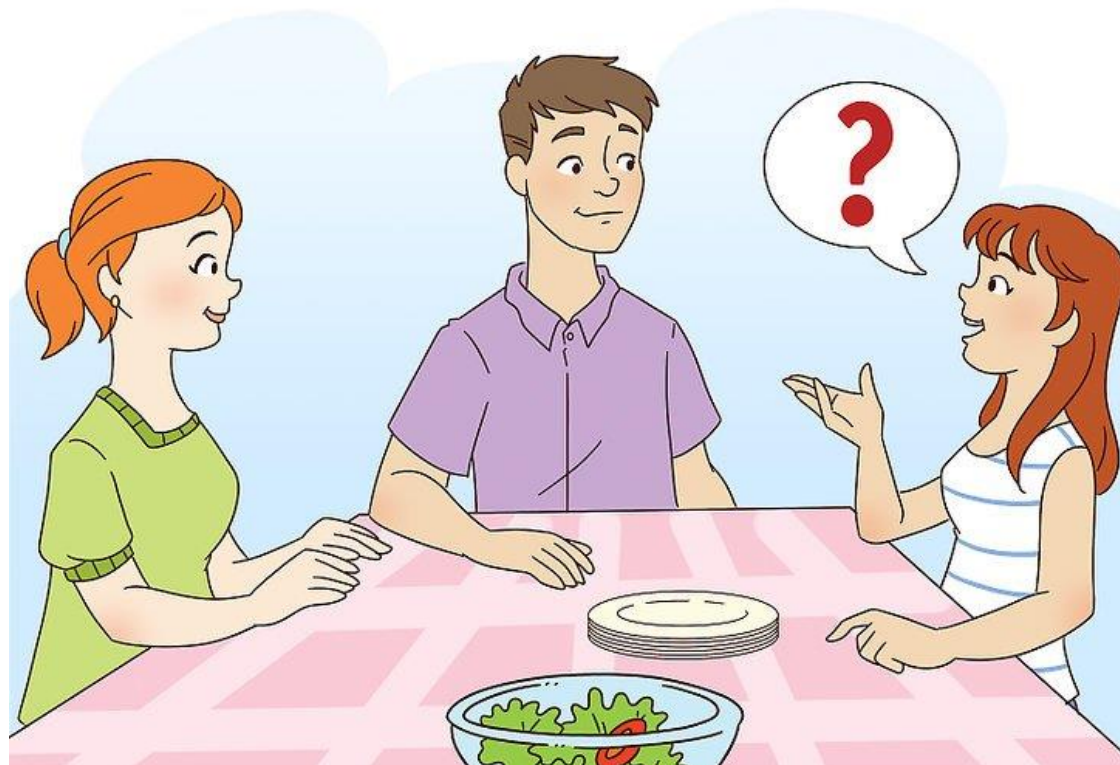


Persuasive Tip #3: Plan what you are going to say so that you can speak clearly and confidently.

- **Knowing your audience .**

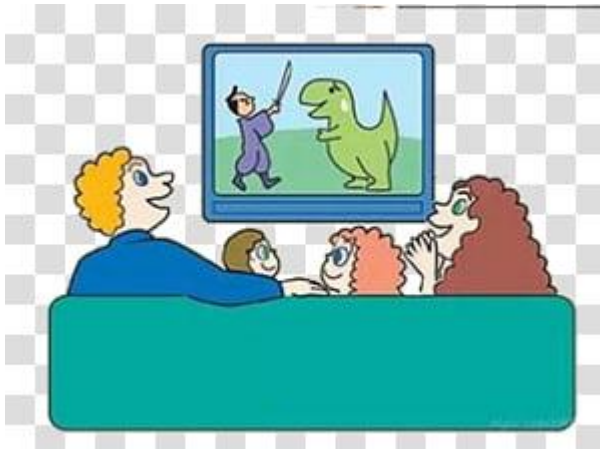
