Plastic Bottle LED Tea Light Candle Holder

Supplies

- Small plastic bottle
- Tissue paper in several different colours
- PVA glue
- Scissors
- LED tea light candle







Cut the bottom of the plastic bottle off, about one third of the way up.



Decorate the whole of the outside of the plastic bottle using tissue paper stuck on with PVA glue. Then cut out a shape, such as a flower or heart, and stick this on. Leave to dry.



Once dry, paint a very thin layer of PVA glue across the top of the design to seal it and protect it, then leave to dry.



Once completely dry, the candle holder is ready to use. Put an LED tea light candle inside; this should illuminate the pattern on the candle holder.



Plastic Bottle LED Tea Light Candle Holder




Supplies

- Small plastic bottle

Step 1. Cut the bottom of the plastic bottle off, about one third of the way up.
