The world has these things called recycling bins.


They help the ocean and the creatures within

Dear Mr Johnson






Did you know?

- It takes over 400 years for plastic to break down.
- 700 different marine species are severely threatened because of plastic in the ocean.
- 22 million tonnes of carbon dioxide is absorbed by the ocean each day!!! This
 makes the water more acidic, which makes it harder for fish to breathe and
 for creatures like crabs, lobsters and coral to grow their shells.
- Lots of plastic is found washed up on beaches all over the world.
- 10% of all dead animals found in beach clean-ups worldwide have been entangled in plastic bags.
- 5 trillion pieces of plastic are estimated to be floating in the world seas.
- 90% of sea birds eat plastic rubbish, mistaking it for food.
- 20% of fish found had plastic in their stomach.

- There is now 5.25 trillion macro and micro pieces of plastic in our ocean and 46,000 pieces in every square mile of ocean weighing up to 269,000 tonnes.
- Every day around 8 million pieces of plastic make their way into our oceans.



SOME AMAZING FACTS ABOUT MARINE POLLUTION

- 1. 52% of sea turtles worldwide have accidentally eaten plastic rubbish in the ocean.
- 2. 22 million tonnes of gas called carbon dioxide (CO2) is absorbed by the ocean each day because of rubbish.
- 3. 443 birds and animals were found in nets during a recent international clean-up.
- 4. 100,000 marine animals die from getting entangled in plastic yearly.
- 5. China is ranked #1 for mismanagement of waste and plastic.
- 6. 300 million tons of plastic gets created yearly.
